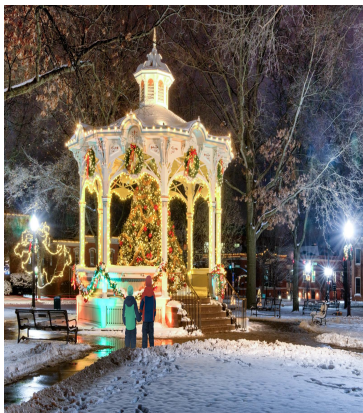


November & December Window Gallery Artist Spotlight - 2023
